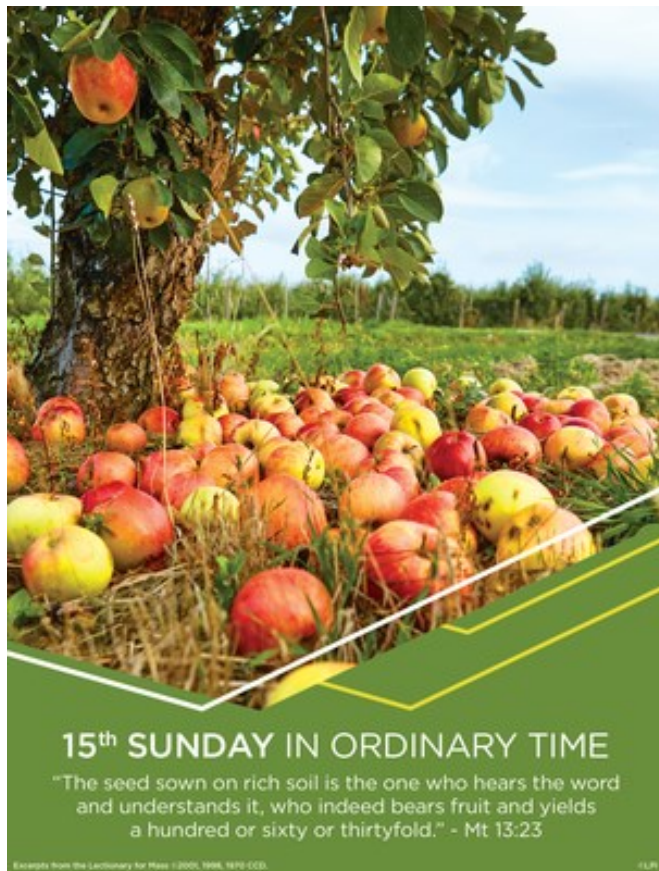

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Why do Catholics Baptize Babies?

This custom dates back to the earliest days of the Church, when St. Paul baptized entire households. When Christianity was legalized 200 years later, infant baptism became the normal practice throughout the Church.

We recognize that in Baptism, we are given the grace to overcome original sin—the human tendency to choose ourselves and our own wills over God—and to become members of the Church. This is the gift we give to infants.

In its essence, the baptism of infants also reminds us adult Christians that the gift of salvation and membership in the Church is God's initiative. It is freely offered to us, regardless of where we might be in life's journey. Salvation isn't something we earn. Instead, we see that Baptism is the beginning of a lifelong process of growing into the disciples that Jesus wants us to be.
