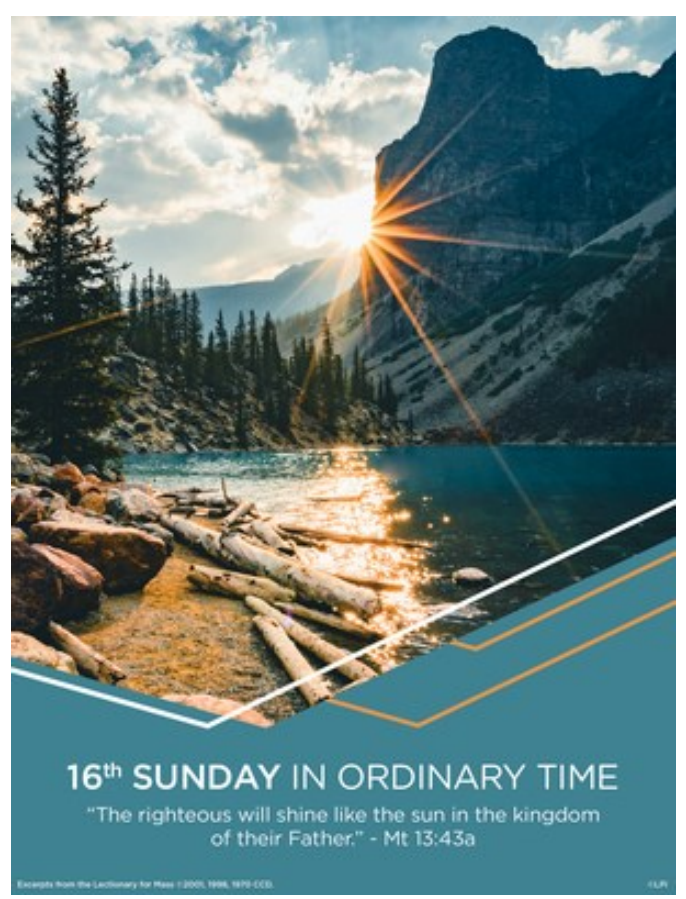

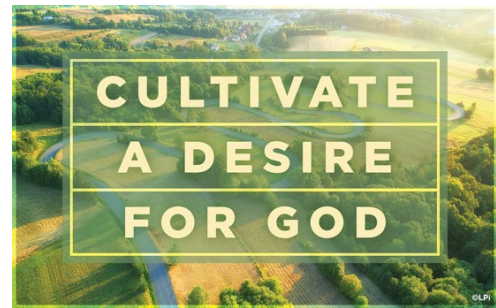

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Why do Catholics eat Fish on Friday?

For centuries, meatless Fridays were the norm for Catholics throughout the world. Friday was chosen because that was the day on which Jesus died, and Christians wanted to find a way to honor that day. The practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays grew out of that desire, and it became an official part of Church teaching until the time of the Second Vatican Council.

In the 1960s, there was a shift in the Church's thinking, in large part because there was a recognition that differences in cultures and economic realities meant that eating or not eating meat had different meanings for different people. For some, it was no sacrifice at all.

Today, Catholics are still instructed to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent. Some continue the older tradition of abstaining all year. Regardless of what we choose, the real value is to see a reflection of Good Friday in each Friday, to remember the self-giving love of Jesus.
