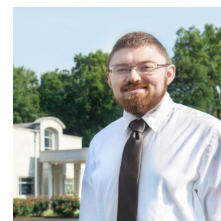

VOCATIONS CORNER

"How They Reacted"

Giving people the news that you have made the decision to go study to be a Catholic priest is what I imagine it's like to fly a spaceship in zero gravity - exciting yet terrifying. I enjoy reading Star Wars novels and am certified in Lightsaber Form I combat: Shii-Cho. As a result, I've received many jokes in being a potential future Catholic Jedi Priest. Revealing your pastoral desire feels great in finally letting people discover a more real "you". It may take time for people to process. I've discerned out once, so I've had the pleasure in sharing the "I'm leaving for seminary" news twice. As a cradle Catholic, my parents always told me that they wanted me to get married or to be ordained a priest. After pursuing both paths, I realized that my overarching call is to priesthood. When I first told my parents that I was applying to seminary, their reaction was, "Well, it's about time!"
